Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP):

Trades Adjustment Assistance (TAA):

Focuses on workers who lost their jobs as a result of increased imports or shifts in production out of the United States. Eligible workers may receive one or more benefits or services. Complete *Contact Form* for more information: foxvalleyjobcenters.com/job-seekers/individualized-services

Unemployment Insurance:

Veterans' Employment and Training Service (VETS):

Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act (WIOA):

Provides employment resources for people looking for a new, high-paying career, including education, training, and job preparation. Call 920.278.9264 for more information.

FoodShare Employment and Training Program (FSET):

Helps Foodshare members build their job skills and find jobs. Job skills training, education activities, interview skills, and work experience opportunities are provided.

Wisconsin Works (W2):

Helps parents on the way to a new career with training, job search, resume help, and cash payments. Also supports new or expectant mothers. Call 855.733.1311 for more information.

Job Access Loan (JAL):

Provides short-term, no interest loans for work-related items to help job seekers with families get or keep a job. Work-related items can include work clothes, tools, cars, housing, and other expenses. Call 855.733.1311 for more information.

Emergency Assistance:

Provides cash assistance for families facing a crisis, like homelessness or other housing emergencies. Funds can be used for security deposit or first month's rent to prevent an eviction for nonpayment of rent or utility disconnection. Call 800.771.8420 for more information.

Wisconsin Employment Transportation Assistance Fund (WETAP):

Provides no-interest loans for car repair or car purchase to eligible individuals who are working or have an accepted job offer. Call 920.292.1336 for more information.

Refugee Services:

Helps refugees and asylum seekers move into their new communities and find jobs to support their families.

Upward Bound:

Helps high school students prepare for college with guidance, in-class assistance, tutoring, college tours, and assistance applying for financial aid. Available at Wild Rose Middle/High School, as well as other schools in Waushara Co.
